The Putrajaya Flower and Garden Festival is Malaysia's largest Flower and Garden Festival to date. The venue for this event is at Lakefront Precinct 2, Putrajaya in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, from 25 August to 2 September 2007, and is held in conjunction with Malaysia's 50th National Day Celebration and alongside the 44th International Federation of Landscape Architects (IFLA) World Congress.

The floral displays by local and international designers and landscape architects are truly awesome. The theme of the show this year is "Rainbow Serenade" and splashes of colours can be seen in every exhibit.

The Putrajaya Flower and Garden Festival has both indoor and outdoor exhibits. The Floria Showcase Garden, Orchid Precinct and Garden Square and Bazaar are located outdoors. The various landscape displays in these areas consist of flowering plants in full bloom that came in a palette of brilliant colours. These displays provide a big visual impact on the visitors.

The indoor section of the Show include the Flower Pavillion; Special Gardens that consist of the Merdeka Entrance Garden, Floral Carpet Garden, International Garden, Indoor Themed Garden, Home Sweet Home, Scented Garden and Education Zone and showcases of flower arrangements in the Floral Window, Floral Art, Flower Power and Creative Flower Arrangement sections.
